2. Necessity of data collection

You are not required by operation of law or contract to provide to us the personal data, however, your personal data is necessary to evaluate the submitted papers, promote the conferences/events as well as the services of the data controller, and to realize and exploit the conference/event.

3. Right of objection, Art. 21 GDPR

The data subject has the right to object, on grounds relating to the data subject's particular situation, at any time, when the processing is based on Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f) GDPR. The data controller will then no longer process the personal data of the data subject unless the data controller can provide compelling reasons for the processing which are worthy of protection and which outweigh the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject or the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

The data subject may at any time object to the processing of the data for the purpose of direct marketing. In the event of an objection, the data controller shall refrain from any further processing of the data for the purpose of direct marketing. The objection shall not affect the lawfulness of processing before the statement of objection.

4. Rights of the data subject

The data subject has the following rights and claims against the controller:

- the right of access (Art. 15 GDPR)
- the right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR)
- the right to erasure (Art. 17 GDPR)
- the right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR)
- the right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)

5. Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority

Without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy, every data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the EU- or EEA-Member State of his or her habitual residence, place of work or place of the alleged infringement if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data relating to him or her infringes this Regulation.

The supervisory authority with which the complaint has been lodged shall inform the complainant on the progress and the outcome of the complaint including the possibility of a judicial remedy pursuant to Art. 78 GDPR.
