We are looking for

a Postdoctoral Researcher in the Department of Household Finance. The Department of Household Finance conducts research on the financial decisions of private households and the interplay between the supply of and the demand for financial services. The research projects in this area are united by the overarching goal of developing solutions that lead to better financial decisions by households.

The position within the department is partially financed by the BMBF-funded research project “Transition labels in climate finance: An empirical and experimental investigation (ClimLabels) – Subproject 4: Perception and use by private investors” with Prof. Dr. Christine Laudenbach being one of the Principal Investigators. Within the project, the postdoctoral researcher will be part of an experimental research group with members from the fields of resource and energy economics, behavioral economics, and (sustainable) finance. The project aims to develop future-oriented ecolabels for products in financial markets, to discuss incentives for emission reductions and to evaluate how these are perceived by retail investors, professionals and fund managers.

The ideal candidate has a Ph.D. in Finance or Economics or a closely related area with a finance focus by the time of appointment or shortly thereafter and has her/his research interest in Household Finance and/or Sustainable Finance and is experienced with experimental research methods.

We offer

The infrastructure of a modern research center with excellent contacts to the scientific and financial community. You will be working in a very attractive working environment in the House of Finance at Goethe University and an enthusiastic team of colleagues. Compensation will be **100% of a full-time position** in accordance with the standards of the public services wage agreement of the State of Hesse (TV-H E 13). The position is initially limited to three years with the option to be continued for another three years, subject to a positive mid-term evaluation. There is no specific teaching load assigned to this position, but involvement in the teaching of Goethe University Frankfurt's Bachelor, Master, and/or Ph.D. programs is highly welcome.

SAFE seeks to increase the share of women in research and thus strongly encourages female scholars to apply. We are also committed to promote the inclusion of persons with disabilities and therefore invites them in particular to apply.
